This session was designed to provide early learning professionals with the knowledge and tools needed to successfully implement learning opportunities from the 'My Family, My Community, My World' section of the Delaware Early Learning Foundations for preschool and the 'Discoveries', 'Social Emotional' and 'Language and Literacy' learning opportunities from the Early Learning Foundations for infants and toddlers. This workshop presents participants with geography and history concepts for young children. Participants will learn techniques that encourage curiosity and expand a child's knowledge of places and spaces beginning within the child's own residence, and expanding to their community and learning environment. As a result of this workshop, children will begin to learn about the past, present, and future through play and activities.

This workshop provides an overview of the theories and developmental sequences of children's growth. Participants are given opportunities to examine how stages of development impact decisions about teaching, appropriate and supportive interactions, and activities. They will learn about children's physical, cognitive, language, social, and emotional development as well as be provided with an overview of each area of development and information about typical patterns of development.

Creating A Quality Family Child Care Program

Participants will explore areas of Family Child Care programming as well as how to arrange the environment to support those areas. This workshop will support the balance of a business and personal shared space; appropriate schedules (including routine and transition times); and other factors that influence the environment, such as light, sound and color.

Cultural Competence for Early Childhood Professionals

This session will introduce and broaden the early care and education professional's awareness of their cultural competency and issues around diversity. Early learning professionals will also develop strategies for working with children and families from diverse cultures and increase their understanding of the NAEYC Code of Ethical Conduct to address ethical dilemmas when working with diverse children and families.

Developmentally Appropriate Practice

The purpose of this session of Developmentally Appropriate Practice (DAP) is to introduce participants to the concept of Developmentally Appropriate Practice, as outlined by NAEYC, and how it impacts quality early childhood education. The focus in this session is to examine the use of DAP principles and guidelines in everyday practice in early childhood education.

Facing the Challenge: Understanding and Addressing Challenging Behavior in Children

In this workshop participants will define "challenging behavior" and examine the possible triggers. This class will teach concrete ways to replace challenging behavior through relationships, environmental strategies, and the use of Functional Behavior Assessments.

In this training, family child care providers will be introduced to the best practices of business in the areas of record keeping (income and expenses), contracts (agreements and policies) and marketing. You will gain valuable resources and techniques for running your family child care business.

Flip It: Flipping the Challenging Behavior

Participants will learn and practice a four step process for children to identify feelings, learn healthy limits, learn self-control and choose socially responsible actions. Participants will learn how to respond positively to everyday challenging behaviors in children 3-8 years of age.

This series will provide both novice and experienced family child care provider with an overview of regulations, multi-age environments, child development, curriculum and social emotional development. Explore integrating your family into your business, the use of your home as a place of business and take advantage of daily routines as activities for children in your program.

Health in Early Care and Education: Asthma and Allergies

This two hour workshop will explain allergies in children, how to recognize and respond to allergies, as well as approaches to allergy management and treatment. During this workshop, the participant will learn what it means for a child to live with asthma, controlling the factors that affect asthma and the basics of asthma management.

Health in Early Care and Education: Diarrhea and Vomiting

Using a variety of instructional methods and tools, early learning professionals will learn information on common causes and management of diarrhea and vomiting children may experience while in child care settings. The purpose of this training module is to provide child care providers with assessment tools, information on prevention, and strategies to intervene if a child has an upset stomach.

Health in Early Care and Education: Head Lice and Lyme's Disease

Enhance your knowledge of Head Lice and Lyme's disease in this two hour workshop.

Participants will learn the methods to identify lice and Lyme's disease in children and current methods of treatment. Strategies taught can be used in early care settings. Includes important information to pass along to parents.

Health in Early Care and Education: Infectious Disease

Early learning professionals will learn how to identify, manage, and prevent problems with infectious and communicable diseases and reduce the incidence of problems. This workshop will help participants identify common infections in children, how to prevent the spread of communicable disease, manage fevers, and demonstrate appropriate techniques to control the spread of disease in the child care setting.

Health in Early Care and Education: Protecting Skin

Enhance your knowledge about a child's skin in this two hour workshop. Topics explored will be: the skin, recognizing skin lesions, skin problems related to chemical or physical contact, skin problems from insect and/or animal contact and the basics of managing skin care in early care settings. Includes important information to be shared with parents.

This two hour workshop will support participants in gaining knowledge about identification, management and prevention of colds and other respiratory problems in children.

How to Administer & Score the Ages & Stages Questionnaire-3 and the Ages & Stages-SE

Participants will understand the importance of early screening and be able to administer, score, and translate results of the Ages & Stages Questionnaire-3 (ASQ-3) and the Ages & Stages Questionnaire-Social Emotional (ASQ-SE). Upon completion of this course, participants will be able to work with families to be proactive in screening for possible areas of delay, while respecting the family's culture, religion, & values. Participants will also become familiar with the referral process.

Implementing Early Learning Foundations (ELF)

This session will introduce practitioners to the Infant/Toddler and Preschool Early Learning Foundations (ELF), revised in 2010; participate in practical hands-on activities; and learn how to incorporate ELF into your experience planning. These learning opportunities (ELF) will provide children infancy through preschool with appropriate skills they need as they develop and prepare for kindergarten.

Implementing Teaching Strategies Gold

This workshop teaches participants to use the TSI Gold, a validated and reliable observational system. This assessment tool is an ongoing and authentic way to assess children birth through kindergarten including children with special needs. This is a private workshop which is currently only being offered to participants selected by their Stars TA's. We are looking for early childhood educators from Star 4 or 5 programs who will be able to implement these practices immediately after participating in the workshop. This workshop supports Stars Standard:

- LO3- Program implements a formative child assessment for all infants, toddlers, and preschoolers a minimum of two times each year and a developmental youth assessment for school-age children/youth annually.

This session introduces early care educators and school-age professionals to inclusive education (working with children with disabilities); to understanding the philosophy and rationale for inclusion; to strategies for working with families; and how to implement inclusion practices.

This series is a comprehensive introduction to Delaware's center-based early care and education. Participants will explore the role of an early care and education professional; learn the basics of health and safety; explore strategies for working with groups of children; and learn how to partner with families.

Leadership for Early Childhood Directors and Administrators

4 Hours

Directors and administrators who are able to distinguish between leadership and management tend to be more successful in business and staff development. Topics in this workshop include characteristics and essential qualities of being a successful leader, what leadership looks like in early childhood, and aspects of team building and strategic planning.

Lesson Planning: Foundations

This workshop provides an overview of the purpose and practicalities of daily lesson planning. Some of the topics include Developmentally Appropriate Practice, individualizing and choosing a lesson planning system, as well as critical skills for long-term planning.

This workshop will help caregivers learn ways to prepare children for literacy and learning, enhance language development through modeling, and will provide skill development that encourages positive parent-child literacy experiences.

This series will address the Core Competencies for School-Age Professionals. It will serve as a foundation of support for new and experienced members of the workforce and include

opportunities for reflective practice.

Multi-Age Learning Environments in Family Child Care

Participants will learn how to choose developmentally appropriate materials and activities; adapt activities based on the needs of the children; and identify the benefits to having a multi-age program. Participants will learn ways to work with infants, toddlers, preschoolers and school age and keep everyone engaged, productive and safe.

Numbers and Counting

3 Hours

Based on the Early Learning Foundations (Mathematics Domain), this workshop demonstrates how numbers and counting are a part of our daily lives. Helping children make the use of these skills second nature is vital to everyday success. Best practices and creative ways to teach children are highlighted to help young children practice numbers and counting. A goal of the workshop is to help children view numbers and counting as an everyday, everywhere skill.

Observation: Strategies for Success

The purpose of this workshop is to introduce participants to the concepts of observation and assessment, and its value in planning for the use of the subsequent information/ data within programs. The workshop gives observation practice opportunities and shows participants how to use observation objectively. Participants will learn how to be purposeful in choosing observation situations and in recording information for the purpose of planning.

RELATE: Infant and Toddler Communication and Learning

This 15 hour series will introduce participants to their role in language development, the role of culture, and how to support family communication. The workshop explores Infant & Toddler curriculum that supports individual children's goals and plans experiences to support all children. Participants will also learn to incorporate developmentally appropriate practices and Early Learning Foundations as a framework for creating and using Curriculum.

Rock Solid Foundations: Friendship and Play Skills

This interactive training invites you to consider ways to promote the social and emotional competence of young children and prevent challenging behavior. Those of us who provide care to young children and their families build our skills in carefully observing the social emotional cues provided to us by the children in order to respond to them with interactions that build responsive, nurturing relationships.

Rock Solid Foundations: Enhancing Emotional Literacy

This interactive training invites you to consider ways to promote the social and emotional competence of young children and prevent challenging behavior. This workshop will talk about shared experiences, acknowledging and labeling emotions, and letting children know that we see, hear, understand and accept their feelings. These are all major strategies that all caregivers can use to develop emotional literacy.

School-Age: Family and Community Partnership

School-Age Credential

OFFERED AS ONLINE WORKSHOP

This workshop explores family communication; family diversity; community and school partnerships; and tools for effective collaboration. Participants will learn how to increase human relationship skills of communication and team work and explore effective problem solving strategies for working together cooperatively in groups and teams.

School-Age: Learning Environments and Curriculum

This workshop explores the learning environment and curriculum in school-age programs/classrooms. This includes intentional program planning; developing activities that encourage creativity and cognitive development; and creating an appropriate indoor and outdoor school-age environment. Participants will also discover ways to incorporate the ERS as we design spaces that show the students that we value them and learn ways to get students involved and to stay engaged with program activities and experiences.

The purpose of this training is to provide participants with information about the social and emotional development and needs of school-aged children. Using the DAP core considerations participants will review child and youth development, learn observation and assessment skills to identify individual skills and needs and learn how to embrace the social and cultural worlds of the students. Participants will also develop the knowledge and skills needed to provide enriching activities to support this development and strategies to work with challenging behaviors.

This workshop will introduce participants to background information on the 8 senses as well as present various sensory discomforts and disorders that both children and adults may experience. Participants will also learn techniques that may calm discomforts felt due to various sensory experiences.

Based on the Early Learning Foundations (Creative Expressions Domain), this workshop invites participants to come experience and learn the value of dramatic play in your classroom. Participants will do hands on activities and use the early learning foundations to assist them in designing an environment to help children learn through dramatic play.

Shapes and Patterns

Based on the Early Learning Foundations (Mathematics Domain), this workshop shows how shapes and patterns are a fun part of math center activities. Learn how to teach geometry and spatial sense; how patterning is the evidence of the skill of sequencing; and how to effectively use shapes and patterns to teach children mathematics concepts while keeping learning interesting and fun. This workshop will show the sequence of skills learned so that children stay engaged.

Show Me Your Math: Rulers & Graphs

Based on the Early Learning Foundations (Mathematics Domain), this is an interactive workshop that focuses on how to teach children about measurement and how to document and record math. Caregivers will learn practical ideas and everyday ways to teach measurement and data concepts from the Early Learning Foundations Mathematics Measurement and Data subdomains.

Sing, Dance & Stomp

Based on the Early Learning Foundations (Creative Expression Domain), this workshop invites you to sing, dance and stomp your way to bringing more music and movement into your class. Learn how to incorporate music and movement into transitions and everyday activities to make learning fun for you and your students!

Participants will develop a vision for Inclusion in their program, learn the importance of collaboration and the role of the "Team" in creating and implementing an Inclusive environment. This workshop helps programs build a foundation of belief and practice of inclusion as a principle of philosophy of practice.

Based on the Early Learning Foundations (Creative Expression Domain), this workshop reminds participants that everyone has different tastes and styles in art, but it can be an amazing means of self-expression as well as a useful assessment tool. Creative expression through visual arts is personal and reflective of personalities and learning. This workshop is fun, interactive and creative and will help early childhood professionals look at art in new ways, teaching them to promote self-expression and learning in children.
