Ages and Stages PD Follow Up Information

As we communicated in the last issue of REACH, the Ages & Stages Developmental Screening system has been revised. There are now two Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ) topics on the DIEEC PD calendar.

New Process and Training Changes for 2018

There are several important changes to note in Stars' processes and training.

1. As we communicated in the last REACH, the **Ages & Stages Training** has been revised, and there are now two Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ) topics on the DIEEC PD calendar at www.dieecpd.org.

Introduction to the Ages & Stages Questionnaires- Developmental Screening Tools (ASQ-3 and ASQ: SE-2). This 3-hour training will focus on the importance of developmental screening, exploring and using the ASQ tools, translating the results, and understanding how to integrate families into the process.

Interpreting the ASQ-3 & ASQ: SE-2. This 3-hour training will focus on the interpretation of screening outcomes, communicating sensitive results, and how to navigate the referral process.

Keep in mind, the developmental screening standard (LO1 for centers, LO2 for family care providers) is an Essential Standard for Star 4 and Star 5 programs when verifying or re-verifying. This standard also requires all developmental screenings completed with the Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ-3 and ASQ: SE2) to be entered in the ASQ online system.

2. **Verification and Assessment Communication Change**
Your Verification and Assessment (V&A) results and feedback will now be emailed directly to you from our V & A Manager, Alvita Kelly, with your TA copied. This change will provide you with a direct contact to reach out to with specific questions regarding the verification process and/or results.

3. **Verification - Blackout Days** As you know, when you request Verification, you may select up to seven blackout dates during the 60-day window. We recognize that at times, it may be a challenge to choose only seven days when you have a prescheduled break. To support you through this process, if a prescheduled break (spring break, holiday break, state observed holiday) falls within your 60-day window, you are now permitted, but not required, to remove those days from the 60-day window,

Ages & Stages Questionnaire-3 and the Ages & Stages SE-2" is grandfathered in as acceptable to satisfy the training requirement portion of DE Stars standard LO1 (ECE) and LO2 (FCC).

- **Program Kits**
Once the "Introduction to ASQ" training has been completed by at least one person at a program, they are eligible for the full ASQ-3 and ASQ:SE-2 kit from OEL if their program has not already received a kit.

Kits are not brought to the PD sessions. Programs need to coordinate directly with Cindy Brown at the Office of Early Learning to arrange mailing of the kit to their program or pick-up after completion of training.

- "Introduction to the ASQ-3 & SE-2" (3-hour PD) satisfies the training requirement portion of DE Stars standard LO1 (ECE) and LO2 (FCC).

The additional "Interpreting the ASQ" (3-hour PD) is strongly suggested in order to further support providers and families with the interpretation and referral process.

Let's Hear it for the Boys

"The Importance of Fostering Emotional Diversity in Boys," psychologists discuss the hidden benefits of experiencing a wide range of emotions, especially as they relate to boys.

Research suggests that boys have the same emotional palette as girls, but often are limited in their expression because their emotions are quickly labeled as anger. This labeling happens as early as infancy. Caregivers of young boys are encouraged to expand their vocabulary when dealing with boys similar to labels they use with girls - words like sad, frustrated, anxious.

Long term, psychologists have found that children who deny emotional vulnerability are also more likely to become

adolescents who engage in health-risk behaviors, such as substance use. Later in development, men suppress (i.e., do not openly express) their emotions more than women; and men, in turn experience greater depressive symptoms, and resort more often to physical violence.
